The baptism of Our Lord cannot help but recall our own and all baptismal blessings. We recall and celebrated our adoptions as daughters and sons, the gift of the Holy Spirit, and the promised company of almighty God when we “pass through the waters...the rivers...fire.” On this day the heavens open again, for this assembly, and we receive the gift of the beloved Son of God in bread and wine.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Near the end of Israel's exile in Babylon, God promises to bring them home. They need no longer be afraid, because the one who formed, created, and called them by name now redeems them from their enemies. God declares precious and honored, and God loves them.

Lector: A Reading from the Book of the prophet Isaiah. (Isaiah 43:1-7)

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, 'Give them up', and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth—everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Lector: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING

Peter and John are sent to support the new Christians in Samaria, a group that was recently baptized after hearing the good news of Christ through the preaching of Philip. Here the Samaritans receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the laying on of hands.

Lector: A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 8:14-17)

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Lector: The Word of the Lord

People: Thanks be to God

THE HOLY GOSPEL

Alleluia. A voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

Alleluia. (Matt. 3:17)

The reading opens with questions about the identity of the Messiah. John the Baptist insists that he is not the Messiah; Instead he points ahead to one who is coming. And whether the voice of God was heard by all or only by Jesus, God settles the matter: Jesus is God's beloved Son.

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Luke (Luke 3:15-17,21-22)

People: Glory to you Lord Christ.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

THE NICENE CREED

People: *That there may be justice and peace on the earth.*

Celebrant: Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

People: *That our works may find favor in your sight.*

Celebrant: Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble;

People: *That they may be delivered from their distress.*

Celebrant: Give to the departed eternal rest;

People: *Let light perpetual shine upon them.*

Celebrant: We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

People: *May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.*

Celebrant: Let us pray for our own needs and those of others.

Silence

The People may add their own petitions.

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with Mary, Joseph, Philip, and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.
