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THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD

YEAR C - RITE II

Monday, December 24, 2018, at 10:00 PM

On this Christmas Eve the people of God gather to celebrate the birth of the Word made flesh, Christ our Lord. Luke recounts the familiar story of shepherds and angels; John's gospel tells of the Word that dwells among us, full of grace and truth. The meaning of Christmas is made clear: the light shines in the darkness. It is the liturgy that we encounter the Word made flesh—in the people of God gathered together as the body of Christ, and in the meal around the holy table. We go forth to be bearers of the light as we proclaim this good news to all the ends of the earth.

The Lighting Of The Nativity Candle

The Church is partially dark as the Service begins. The Celebrant, acolytes, and choir enter the nave in silence. All stand, as the Celebrant greets the people with these words.

Celebrant: Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: *Thanks be to God*

The procession proceeds to the chancel for the lighting of the Nativity Candle. The choir enters their stalls while the priest and the altar ministers pause at the advent wreath for the lighting of the nativity candle.

The Celebrant continues.

Jesus said, “You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one lights a lamp to put it under a bucket, but on a lamp-stand where it gives light for everyone in the house. And you, like the lamp, must shed light among your fellow men, so that they may see the good you do, and give glory to your Father in heaven.” *Matthew 5: 14-16*

The Celebrant then continues

Let us pray.

Almighty God, we give you thanks for surrounding us, as daylight fades, with the brightness of the vesper light; and we implore you of your great mercy that, as you enfold us with the radiance of this light, so you would shine into our hearts the brightness of your Holy Spirit; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

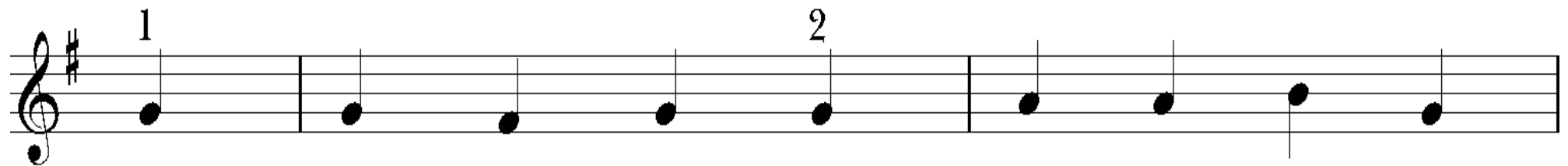
The candles at the Altar are now lighted, as are other candles and lamps as may be convenient.

During the candle-lighting silence is kept.

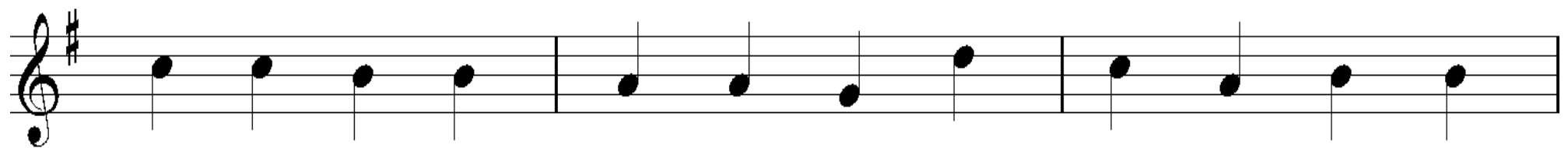

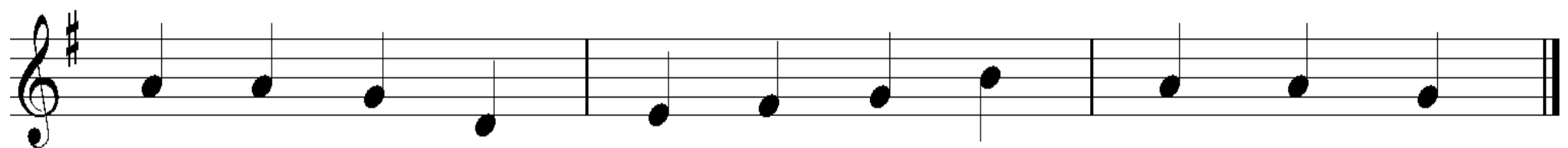

Station at the Christmas Creche

The Celebrant and acolytes would now process to the Christmas Creche to bless it while the Lay Eucharistic Ministers go to their stalls.

The figure of the Christ Child may be carried in the procession and placed in the creche. Other figures may also be brought in if desired.

FIRST READING

Isaiah 62: 6-12

The prophet invites the people to give God no rest until God reestablishes Jerusalem. In turn, they will receive names full of promise: Holy People, the Redeemed of the Lord, a City Not Forsaken.

Reader: A Reading from the Book of the prophet Isaiah 62:6-12

Upon your walls, O Jerusalem, I have posted sentinels; all day and all night they shall never be silent. You who remind the LORD, take no rest, and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it renowned throughout the earth. The LORD has sworn by his right hand and by his mighty arm: I will not again give your grain to be food for your enemies, and foreigners shall not drink the wine for which you have labored; but those who garner it shall eat it and praise the LORD, and those who gather it shall drink it in my holy courts.

Go through, go through the gates, prepare the way for the people; build up, build up the highway, clear it of stones, lift up an ensign over the peoples. The LORD has proclaimed to the end of the earth: Say to daughter Zion, 'See, your salvation comes; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.' They shall be called, 'The Holy People, The Redeemed of the LORD'; and you shall be called, 'Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken.'

Reader: *The Word of the Lord.*

People: **Thanks be to God.**

Titus 3: 4-7

God saves us not because of what we do. Rather, God is a God of mercy and salvation who graciously cleanses us in baptism and renews our lives through the Holy Spirit.

Reader: A Reading from the Letter of Paul to Titus 3:4-7

But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water* of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Reader: The Word of the Lord

People: Thanks be to God

THE NICENE CREED

BCP p. 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,
